2012 – 2013 Campus Improvement Plan Executive Summary

The Campus Improvement Council considered a great deal of student performance data and other data as we crafted the Campus Improvement Plan (CIP). The committee looked at the TAKS and STAAR performance by student groups for each subject and compared them to past performances for CSMS, current CSISD performances as well as the state performance.

The committee observed that the African American and economically disadvantaged student groups were comparable to other CSISD schools as well as state-wide performance. We also recognized that the subject areas with the greatest potential for improvement for the 2012 - 2013 school year will again be math and science.
