It was further recommended that future projects included in the bond should be an additional intermediate school campus, an additional middle school campus and an additional elementary school campus along with renovations to the Oakwood Intermediate front entrance, additional restrooms at Cypress Grove Intermediate, renovations and additional lockers room facilities for AMCMS for both boys and girls athletics, converting classroom spaces to flexible learning spaces for both intermediate and middle schools, additional busses, additional needs in technology, deferred maintenance land acquisition. Items considered but not included in the recommendations were a performing arts center and a sports and recreation center. August 17, 2015 is the last day to call a bond election, which would require a special meeting, as the regularly scheduled meeting is August 18 th .
