Superintendent Ealy stated that there are three places up for reelection, Place 3, Place 4 and Place 5. The members currently in those positions, Michael Wesson, Jeff Harris and Quinn Williams are not seeking re-election. We had one person file for election for each place and none of the three places are contested so there is no need to hold an election. Additionally, not having an election would save the district approximately \$25,000. It is the recommendation of the administration that we cancel the election.

<u>MOTION 4828</u>: I make a motion to save the school district \$25,000 by not having an election since there are no positions opposed. The motion was made by Trustee Michael Schaefer and seconded by Trustee Amanda Green. The motion carried with five ayes and zero nos.

Superintendent Ealy stated that due to the district not running its own tax office, we partner with the other taxing entities in the area to run the Brazos Central Appraisal District. CSISD is represented by a Board and two members of the Board represent the interests of

		CSISD. These two places are two-year terms appointed by the CSISD Board of Trustees. Superintendent Ealy recommended that our current representatives, Tim Jones and John Flynn, continue to represent us for the next two years. Superintendent Ealy has spoken to both of them and they are both willing to serve. President Harris echoed those sentiments by stating how appreciative the district is of the job they have done and for their many years of service. MOTION 4829: I make a motion to approve Tim Jones and John Flynn for 2 year terms. The motion was made by Trustee Michael Schaefer and seconded by Secretary Geralyn Nolan. The motion carried with five ayes and zero nos.
