

ORDER OF ELECTION

AN ORDER AUTHORIZING A GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING COLLEGE STATION INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES AT-LARGE POSITION SIX AND AT-LARGE POSITION SEVEN, BY THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT; ESTABLISHING EARLY VOTING LOCATIONS AND ELECTION DAY VOTE CENTERS FOR THIS ELECTION; AND MAKING PROVISIONS FOR CONDUCTING THE ELECTION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE COLLEGE STATION INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. A general election is ordered to be held by the College Station Independent School District Board of Trustees at the various Election Day Vote Centers within the CSISD boundaries, as hereinafter designated, on November 3, 2020 from the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. This general election will be conducted jointly with Brazos County and will be administered for the School District by the Brazos County Election Administrator, but this general election is not a county-wide election. At this election the qualified voters of the School District will elect two Board Members for at-large position six and at-large position seven respectively with each position having a term of three years.

SECTION 2. CSISD Board policy operates its election on a plurality vote, meaning one (1) vote more than an opponent will declare a winner; thereby, no runoff elections are required;

SECTION 3. The polling places for this election shall be as follows:

SECTION 4. Joint early voting shall be conducted by personal appearance and by mail. The period for early voting by personal appearance for the general election shall be October 19 through October 30, 2020. Optical scan ballots shall be used for early voting by mail and direct recording electronic voting machines shall be used for early voting by personal appearance. The Early Voting Clerk for said elections shall be the Brazos County Election Administrator. She shall determine the number of election workers to be hired and arrange for training of all election workers. Early voting by personal appearance for the general election shall be conducted jointly at the locations and on the following dates and times specified by the Brazos County Election Administrator:

SECTION 5. Early voting by mail ballot shall be conducted in accordance with applicable provisions of the Texas Election Code. The address of 300 East William J. Bryan, Suite 100, Bryan, Texas 77803, shall be the early voting clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent for the School District.

SECTION 6. All early votes and other votes to be processed in accordance with early voting procedures pursuant to the Texas Election Code shall be delivered to the Early Voting Ballot Board at the Brazos County Election Administrator's office. Early votes shall be counted at the central counting station. The Early Voting Ballot Board shall perform in accordance with applicable provisions of the Election Code.

SECTION 7. A Direct Record Electronic ("DRE") System, as the term is defined in the Texas Election Code, shall be utilized in connection with the election. This system shall be utilized for all early voting as well as for all voting conducted on Election Day. The Brazos County Election Administrator will appoint a programmer, who shall prepare a program for the automatic tabulating equipment. Ample voting equipment shall be provided for early voting and in each of the vote centers on Election Day. The central counting station is established as the Brazos County Elections Administration Office, 300 East William J. Bryan, Suite 100, Bryan, Texas.

SECTION 8. The Brazos County Election Administrator will appoint the Early Voting Ballot Board, a Presiding Judge of the Central Counting Station, a Tabulation Supervisor of the Central Counting Station, and a Central Counting Station Manager.

SECTION 9. The election will be held in accordance with the policies of College Station ISD and the laws of the State of Texas.

SECTION 10. Notice of the election, including a Spanish translation thereof, will be published at least once in a newspaper published in College Station on or after October 4, 2020 and on or before October 24, 2020, and will be posted in the display case at College Station ISD Central Administrative Offices on or before October 13, 2020.

SECTION 11. A writ of election as required by the Texas Election Code will be delivered on or before October 19, 2020 by the Brazos County Election Administrator to the presiding and alternate judges of each vote center in which the election is ordered to be held.

SECTION 12. Testing of the automatic tabulating equipment will be performed and notice thereof will be given in accordance with Subchapter D of Chapter 127 of the Texas Election Code.

SECTION 13. If any portion of this Ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 14. That this ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
