## **Resolution of the Board to Set Tax Rate**

BE IT RESOLVED, on August 17, 2021, we, the Board of Trustees of the College Station
Independent School District, hereby levy or set the tax rate on \$100 valuation for the district for
the tax year 2021 at a total tax rate of \$1.2152 to be assessed and collected by the duly
specified assessor and collector as follows:

- \$ 0.9522 for the purpose of maintenance and operations, and
- \$ 0.2630 for the purpose of payment of principal and interest on debts.

Such taxes are to be assessed and collected by the tax officials designated by the district.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY 2.65% PERCENT (based on the no new revenue rate) AND WILL RAISE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS ON A \$100,000 HOME BY APPROXIMATELY \$24.62.

Please be advised that a signed Option 3 **Agreement for the Purchase of Attendance Credit** must be received by January 15, 2022.

The district may proceed with its tax rate adoption process once the Texas Education Agency has determined the district's maximum compressed tax rate via the Local Property Value Survey subsystem of the Foundation School Program system in the Texas Education Agency Login (TEAL).
