  - Trustee Kimberly McAdams reminded everyone that the Budget Committee will be meeting this Thursday. We really appreciate the community being involved in that process and coming to those meetings. Also of note is that Early Voting for the Primary Elections started today and is going on for the next two weeks. These are elections for County Officials, lots of State races that will impact our school district, and even some federal races.
- CSISD Education Foundation
  - Secretary Kristin Wilson said the Education Foundation met today. 50 Men went off without a hitch. We had a lot of participation as we always do. Chrissy Hester, Director of Student Services, [reviewed](#) Senate Bill 11, which requires that the school board consider whether to provide a period of prayer and reading of the Bible or other religious texts outside of class time for every campus in the district. This State policy is more restrictive than current Federal Law. Our recommendation is that we decline to adopt a resolution.
